

Accessibility Statement for Proud to Care Oxfordshire

Proud to Care Oxfordshire is committed to providing an accessible website that is easy to use by anyone, whatever their age, background, access device or level of ability/disability.

For example, that means you should be able to:

- change colours, contrast levels and fonts
- zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen
- navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- navigate most of the website using speech recognition software listen to most of the website using a screen reader (including the most recent versions of JAWS, NVDA and Voice-over)

We've also made the website text as simple as possible to understand.

We have designed this website with features that make it easier to use by everyone, including those with visual, auditory, physical, speech, cognitive, or neurological disabilities. We are aiming to meet the [Web Content Accessibility Guidelines \(WCAG\)](#), which are the international standard for accessible websites and content.

How accessible is this website?

This website has been developed to be as accessible as possible. However, we know some parts of this website aren't fully accessible:

- some of our online forms are difficult to navigate using just a keyboard
- some links may not be distinct enough and may be difficult for people with moderate visual impairments to read
- some content may be difficult to navigate using a screen reader
- pinch to zoom is enabled on tablet and mobile
